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
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

# Architec

The site situated amidst 22 acre plot within a the newly built structures at **Sinclairs Doors Retreat**, **Chalsa, Jalpaiguri, West Bengal, India** offered a unique opportunity to the architects at **Square Consultancy Services** to come vis-a-vis with the verdant nature and explore the potential of local natural materials in constructing a built environment that mainly catered to the city fleeing tourists



et in the foothills of the Eastern Himalayas the location of the project 'Resort at Chalsa, Jalpaiguri, West Bengal, India' designed by Square Consultancy Services is flanked by the Gorumara forest sanctuary, tea plantations and torrential rivers. To meet the growing tourist attractions which consisted mainly family and large corporate groups, the client wanted the architects to develop the new structures at Sinclairs Doors Retreat as a growing health resort with a star category health club offering modern amenities. (the client held a sprawling resort within a large plot of land on the top of Chalsa hill, which lay on one of the important tourist nodes. They were very aware of the virgin greenery the resort offered and the brief was thus to integrate the health club with minimal intervention of the surrounding, to develop a structure that remains congruous with the casual greenery all around it). Design blend into the natural setting right from the stage of inception and the use of concrete and steel is avoided in the rendering of spaces while emphasizing the locally available natural materials.

The reception lobby, *lounge*, restaurant, common areas, and a triplet of suites are housed in cottages. The built spaces are retained, so that the

interiors or exteriors come as a natural corollary to the myriad of greenness that is omnipresent. The alphabets of design were dhoopi, a kind of cheap, light weight easily available wood and bamboo (another easily available material). Two symbolic windows of bamboo forests were created using bamboos that are naturally treated under the sun. The walls of the corridors were envisaged as exhibitory backgrounds for handmade paintings adding colourful vibe to the place.

The three suites draw its influences from three different local influences adding frivolity to the spaces. The natural texture of raw planks and dead tree trunks writes the travelogue of the place that was once a hunter' eden at the "Bandook Babu's Kothl" - a local dialect for the hunters lodge. "Noveau Ville" is a contemporary eclectic style cottage, elegantly wrapped in wall paper, platform bed and furniture that is

exploring the potential of local natural materials.

urbane in their form and appearance. **'Burra Sahib'** suite is a reminiscent of the exotic, quaint and luxurious lifestyle of the colonial tea estate planters of North Bengal.

### CONTEXTUAL REFERENCE AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS

The resort sitting meagerly within a stretch of virgin greenery, 22 acres of trees, lawns, gardens and orchards offer an endless diversity to the



visitor. Extensive design maneuvers were rendered meaningless as nature herself-has taken the task of embellishment. Thus design involved punctuating the spaces into humanly perceptible chunks of areas with natural illumination. The

backdrop of natural green was omnipresent. It was felt that identifying key areas of activity and rendering them according to usage is an effective design solution. Trees and hedges were used as visual screens.

### DETAILING/USE OF MATERIALS

Handmade furniture & others, artifacts and other accessories in the resort are of *Dhoopi wood, bamboo, sal, rattans, straw mats,* glass etc and were made of local labor; all these were naturally treated at site. Indoor plants were in abundance and are an essential ingredient of the interiors.

## SENSORIAL & SPATIAL EXPERIENCES

It was felt that indirect illumination should be used and for this lights were designed and are handmade so that they became a part of the paneling itself. Large glazing areas were created to bring in the natural light within the indoors.



# COHESION TO CONCEPT IN DESIGN DEVELOPMENT

The overall design process sums up to the fact that inspite of using low-cost locally and naturally available materials, the users were provided with all the modern amenities and facilities.
